




Why EU laws matter

- 80 % of national laws originate in Brussels : myth or reality ?
- However, some of the <u>most important</u> ones are adopted at EU level and affect a wide range of areas.

The construction industry in the EU: key figures

- > 10 % of GDP
- > 3 million companies (incl. 92 % of SMEs)
- > ~20 million jobs
- > 40 % of total EU energy consumption
- > 36 % of carbon emissions
- > 3.2 million tons of raw materials
- ~€100 billion of exports to non-EU countries

- EFSI aka Juncker investment fund to generate €500 billion of investment by 2020
- Horizon 2020 (€80 billion*)
- Connecting Europe Facility (€30 billion*)
- * Budgets for the programming period 2014-2020

- European Social dialogue (FIEC & EFBWW)



 Construction & Demolition waste management protocol
 Guidelines for pre-Demolition & Renovation waste audits
 Level(s): a common framework for building sustainability performance
- Waste management & hierarchy
 Waste framework directive (2008)







4. Shift towards a low-carbon economy



- Cutting greenhouse gas emissions
 20 % by 2020*
 40 % by 2030*
 80 % by 2050*
 * compared to 1990 levels
- Ecodesign directive for energy-using products (2009)
- Renewable energy directive (2009) 20 % of the energy mix by 2020
- Energy efficiency directive (2012) 20 % increase in EE by 2020
- Energy performance of buildings and renovation of existing buildings (mandatory NZEBs by 2021)
